Our History ... *It all started over apple pie*

In 1960 Kenneth Schor and Reverend John Koelemay were in the kitchen slicing apple pies to serve as dessert at the Gentilly Methodist Church men's meeting. Schor and Reverend Koelemay discussed the possibility of building a hospital, as the need was clearly evident. There were no nearby hospitals in the eastern New Orleans area, and the city's healthcare institutions were experiencing a severe bed shortage. A wait of 45 days for elective surgery was not uncommon. The original board member and benefactor of the hospital, Pendleton Lehde, helped pave the way to potential donors on numerous occasions as Schor and Reverend Koelemay learned to "pass the hat".



Choosing the site for the hospital may have been the easiest aspect of getting the project underway. In order to serve the Gentilly and East Gentilly area, the primary service area at the time, the eastern side of the Industrial Canal was the only logical choice. There was no Interstate 10 at the time and there were many deaths from heart attacks and accidents because hospitals were too far away, or because the Industrial Canal Bridge was in the "up" position.

Community leader George Williams of Metairie and the late Bill James of Ruston each donated five acres of what is now Crowder Boulevard at I -10. With \$60,000 the hospital organizer bought another five acres of what was Lake Forrest Plaza Shopping Center at Read and I -10. Those 15 acres were used in a swap for the present 23 acres, and the rest is history...

1967... Construction began

1968... The first patient was admitted and the first baby was born on Sept 25th.

1969... The hospital's first intensive care unit opened

1971... One hundred eighty-one beds were in full utilization as a coronary care unit and department of cardiac studies opened

1985... Methodist Care Center for the treatment of minor emergencies opened in Chalmette. Home Health services were established.

1986... The Methodist Psychiatric Pavilion admits its first patient.

1989... The first open heart surgery was conducted

1991... Physicians Medical Plaza opened to accommodate a growing medical staff

1994... Advanced Surgery Center opened. First hospital wide CQI team launched. Medical Center of East New Orleans (MCENO) was acquired.

2003... Sale of majority ownership of Pendleton Memorial Methodist Hospital to Universal Health Services. Establishment of the formal mission for our Legacy Foundation.

2005... Methodist Hospital closes as a result of Hurricane Katrina

MHSF office establishes temporary offices and in pursuant of our mission begins the rebuilding process

2008... Moved into new MHSF building at Oak Harbor Boulevard, Slidell, LA

Our Mission

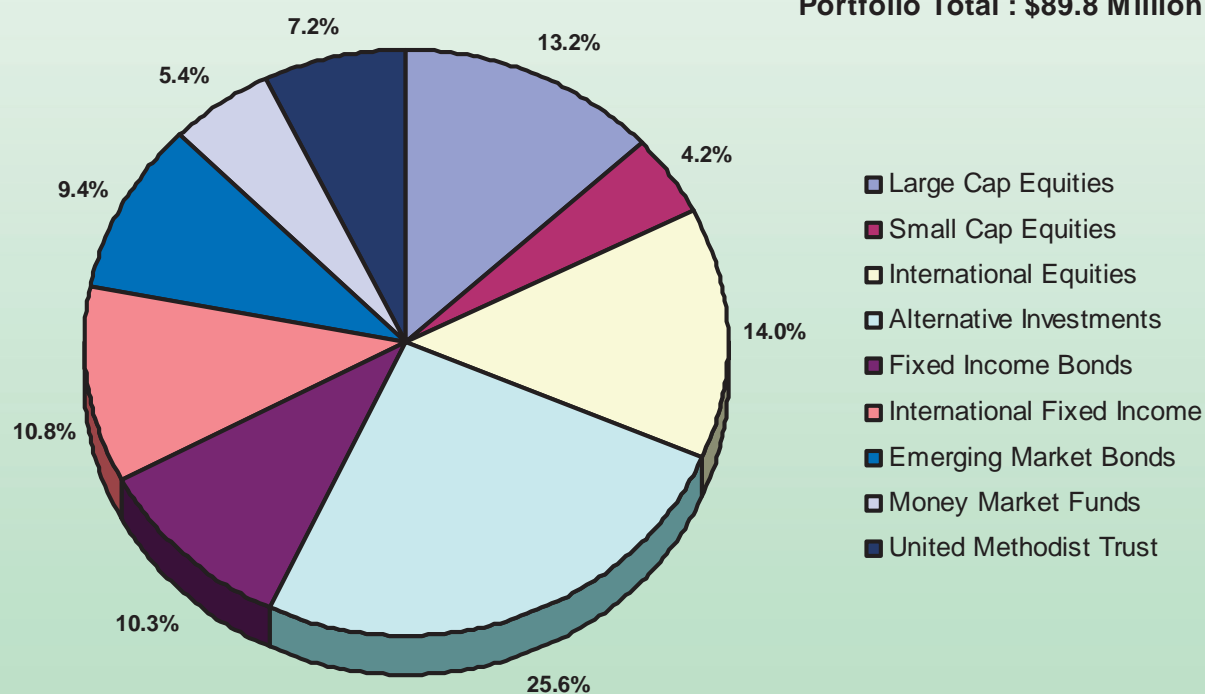


Tree of Life

Healthy Lifestyle Choices

Helping Kids Make the Most Out of Life



Healthy Lifestyle Choices (HLC) is a New Orleans based non-profit dedicated to laying a foundation for healthier children. Founded in 2000, HLC is a comprehensive educational organization that empowers children with the knowledge and skills to make healthier choices in the areas of nutrition, fitness, safety, conflict resolution / violence prevention and substance abuse prevention.

HLC employs a specifically designed school-based curriculum for the children in pre-K through grade 6. This program provides the children with a skill set needed to avert negative behavior and to implement healthy choices before adolescence.

In-depth surveys have revealed three of the eight schools reported that they have observed immediate effects on student behavior and positive changes in school climate. The HLC program has an impact on their students overall academic performance. HLC also utilizes this curriculum to empower educators with ideas and strategies to make the school environment healthier and more inviting – the kind of place where people want to work and children love to learn.

Our Lady of Holy Cross College Nursing Program

Our Lady of Holy Cross College was founded in 1916 as a Ministry of the Marianites of Holy Cross. With an overwhelmingly successful graduating rate of 94%, Our Lady of Holy Cross College is renowned for producing some of the best nurses in the region. This program addresses the great demand for skilled healthcare professionals in our community. To address the need for quality healthcare professionals, Methodist Health System Foundation, Inc., offers needed financial assistance for the Nursing Scholarship Program. This assistance presents opportunities for students to focus on the combination of a quality education and intensive clinical experience without the financial pressures. This means students graduate with not only a high skill level, but also a deep sense of dedication and caring born out of the OLHCC mission.

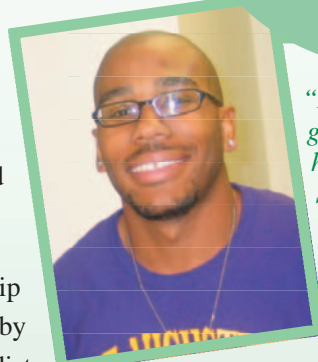


The scholarship funds donated by the Methodist Health System Foundation since 2005 have enabled OLHCC nursing students to

successfully continue their degree programs and become nurses in the New Orleans area. These scholarship dollars made a substantial difference after Hurricane Katrina, during which the students lost their homes and were displaced by the storm.

In response to the outstanding performance, their dedication to return to the community to fill the void of healthcare services and by participants in the OLHCC nursing scholarship program Methodist Health System Foundation created a \$100,000 **Endowment Scholarship** to meet the needs of the deserving and dedicated students of OLHCC. With the establishment of the MHSF endowed scholarship in 2008, the scholarship funds will be available in perpetuity to many future generations of nurses.

Kingsley House

Counseling and Outreach Program

Kingsley House provides mental health counseling and health and nutrition outreach to residents throughout Orleans Parish with emphasis on New Orleans East. This program seeks to improve the mental, physical and nutritional health of the area's residents by providing services in the community, often in the homes of the participants.



Since its inception in 2007, the Counseling and Outreach Program has counseled 422 individuals. Approximately 25% of residents were from New Orleans East and St. Bernard Parish. Following our intervention, 80% of these residents showed improvement in their overall emotional well being, reporting that they feel less anxious and stressed and are better equipped to manage the everyday challenges that they face.

Additionally, over 2,000 individuals have been assisted with obtaining Medicaid and food stamps. 23% of these residents live in New Orleans East. The targeted outreach in New Orleans East has resulted in a 60% increase in overall Medicaid applications from the 70126, 70127 and 70128 zip codes since Hurricane Katrina. Kingsley House has significantly increased our neighborhood canvassing efforts, participation in community fairs and outreach activities with businesses, churches and schools to spread the word about Medicaid, Food Stamp and Counseling programs available through the program.

American Cancer Society's Hope Lodge



The American Cancer Society's Patrick F. Taylor Hope Lodge in New Orleans provides free accommodations to cancer patients and their families when they are receiving outpatient cancer treatment away from home. With the continued support from Methodist Health System Foundation, Inc., Hope Lodge has offered free lodging for cancer patients living at least 40 miles away who are receiving treatment in the metropolitan New Orleans area. Each guest suite is equipped with a private bath and sleeping accommodations for two. A central kitchen, multiple laundry facilities, an exercise room, nondenominational chapel and community recreational areas are among the amenities Hope Lodge guests have access to, free of charge.



"This place is wonderful. If it wasn't for the Hope Lodge, I would not be able to afford to come to New Orleans for treatment," Simpson said. "Everyone is so kind and warm. The staff goes out of their way to make sure you are comfortable."

Greater New Orleans Immunization Network



In the spring of 1998, the Greater New Orleans Immunization Network (GNOIN) was created in April 1998 when Christian Health Ministries partnered with several area hospitals to implement an immunization program for the children of Metropolitan New Orleans. The primary objective of the Greater New Orleans Immunization Network is to protect all children from vaccine preventable diseases with focus on increasing immunization rates for children.

The 2007 NIS shows that childhood immunization rates for 19-35 month-olds -- the age group GNOIN places its greatest focus on -- in Louisiana increased to the same level as the National rate of 77%. Louisiana's ranking improved to 28th. While this reflects improvement, it also indicates that approximately 23% of toddlers in Louisiana are not fully vaccinated.



SKIP School Kids Immunization Program

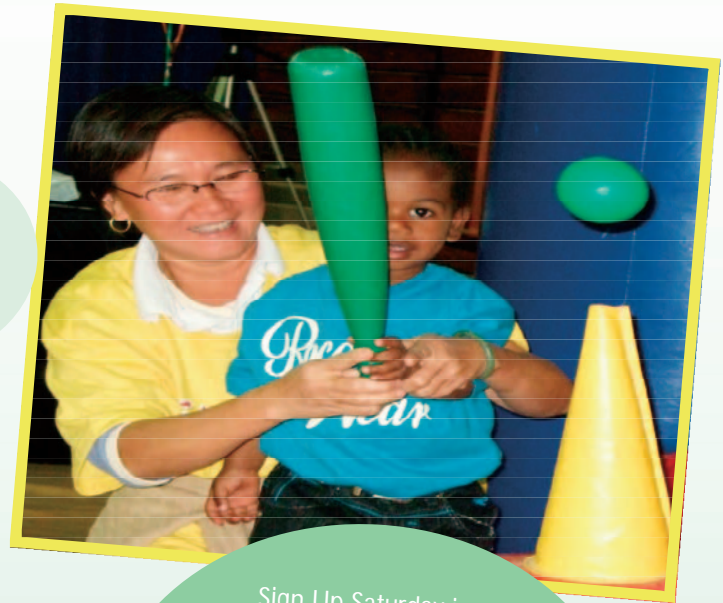
GNOIN representatives travel to targeted schools to perform the required immunizations and record assessments as well as offer training and assessment tools for school personnel. Immunization education is provided at schools for teachers, parents and students. Methodist Health System Foundation awarded SKIP a three year grant through 2010 to expand the SKIP Program in New Orleans East and St. Bernard Parish to ensure that children in these targeted areas will have updated immunizations and healthcare resources in these disaster-affected areas in the future.

Sign Up Saturday is a comprehensive event designed to educate and activate the community. It is a one stop shop for families to learn of physically active programs in the area. The expo also provides health education, screenings, demonstrations, games and activities for the kids.

The University of New Orleans Human Performance Center was the ideal backdrop for this well attended Sign Up Saturday event. Although all demographic segments of the population were reached through media efforts, grassroots efforts targeting the under-served population by working with schools, community groups and government organizations to ensure attendance by those families most in need of services.

The primary target for screenings and activities was 5 to 14. With over 600 participants representing dozens of families from the New Orleans area including 387 children that participated in free health screenings.



15% of children failed the hearing screening and 27% failed the vision screening

These families were directed for follow up provider assistance.



In order for the community to experience 100% from the donated resources and contributions, Methodist Health System Foundation, Inc. served as host partner and supplied event organization and logistic support through a partnership with SportsCare, Inc., The David Toms Foundation, Cox Communications as well as a variety of organizations that provided financial support and in kind services, health screenings, products and volunteers for the event.

Scope of Services

In fulfillment of its Mission, the Methodist Health System Foundation, Inc. engages in services organized within three domains:

- **Grantmaking**
- **Oversight of Pendleton Memorial Methodist Hospital Run Out**
- **Management of Programs and Services**

School-Based Health Centers

Chalmette School Based Health Clinic

The MHSFI School-Based Health Center program has become an integral part of the health care system of Chalmette. It provides outstanding medical and mental health resources and services necessary to promote and improve student's health and academic capability. In August 2006, MHSFI introduced the School-Based Health Center Program at Chalmette High School, located in St. Bernard Parish. The Chalmette High School, School Based Health Center, currently sees on average 60 students per day during school hours. The SBHC team includes a medical doctor, a psychiatrist, nurse practitioners, a registered nurse, med tech, social worker, and data entry/coordinator. Together, they cover all aspects of the student's care and provide much needed services to the students and making a positive difference in their lives and that of their community. During school hours, the SBHC provides services to students ranging from acute illness, comprehensive sports physicals, chronic illness management, preventive care and more. The SBHC staff involves parents in the care of their child, and makes referrals to specialists when warranted.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

- Overweight 14 year old girl came to the health center with generalized complaints - weakness, palpitations, dizziness. After evaluation by NP, she was found to have undiagnosed Diabetes mellitus type 2. Referred her to a local pediatrician who is now managing her Diabetes.
- 16 year old boy came in with generalized chest pain. After evaluation and an ekg, the boy was found to have cardiac arrhythmia. Referred to local cardiology where he was put on heart monitor, and found to have undiagnosed heart murmur.



CSBHC has partnered with several programs to provide a comprehensive program for their students.

Kidmed - Louisiana's Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Programs through its EPSDT provides preventive health screening, diagnosis, and treatment services for suspected vision, hearing, dental and medical problems.

Greater New Orleans Immunization Network - Offering immunizations at the center

New Orleans Speech and Hearing Center - The New Orleans Speech and Hearing Center is committed to the improving the communication of children and adults who are affected by speech, language and hearing disorders, in order to improve the quality of life and help them connect with others. In a collaborative effort to serve the children of the community a partnership was formed to provide eye screening equipment specifically reserved for testing at Chalmette School Based Health Clinic.

Management Services

Affordable Practice Management Services

The Methodist Management Services Organization (MSO) has provided affordable Practice Management Services to the Greater New Orleans and Gulf Coast region for over 10 years. MSO customizes services that are designed to alleviate the burden of accounts receivable management from the physician's office which then allows the physician to focus on quality healthcare.

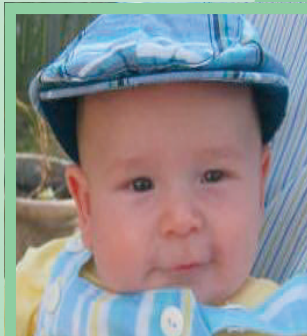
